Thomas Castle (Corporal, Royal Berks)

George Caswell (Hampshire Rgt)

George Comfrey (Bantam Corps)

William H. Jones (Hampshire Rgt)

In the 1911 census there is a William Jones, 18, stable lad, and also a William Henry Jones, 19, stepson of Fred Davies who was a stable lad.

Arthur King (Berks Yeomanry)

From Hungerford, son of Annie Wells who grew up in East Ilsley.

Henry Lewis (AVC)

Robert MacKenzie (ASC, Remounts)

Probably an error for Charles Frederick Mackenzie

William Matthews (Hampshire Rgt)

Possibly William Matthews 1870-1916. No known previous military service so unlikely due to age.

James McCalmont (ASC, Remounts)

Harold Morris (AVC)

Known to have been a stable lad.

Captain H. Nailor (*sic*) (RFA)

Father of Harry & Jim Naylor, based in India and not on active service.

Ernest E. Sparkes* (Corporal, Military Mounted Police)

William Whitlock (HMS New Zealand)

Brother of Edward who is on the War Memorial.

George Wilson (Bucks Yeomanry)**

Walter Walcroft*** (AVC)

*Ernest Edward Sparkes, b 1887 Shrivenham, father in police, was in Army 1911.

***(NWN) Dec 1914 - News has been received of the death of George Wilson who was serving in the Bucks Hussars now at Cromer. He was accidentally killed by the explosion of a cartridge.*

No record has been found of this, there is no matching death registration. Probably a misunderstanding as he isn't shown as deceased in the later lists.

All seem to have no overseas service (except possibly Fred Marshall). Perhaps this is why they weren't included.

Harry Bradfield *(7 months home service in ASC Forage Dept)*

George Fitsall *(stable lad from Surrey, home service 1918-1919)*

William Grey (*10 months home service in ASC Forage Dept*)
Herbert Lowe (*trainer from Kennet House, called up aged 49 in Sep 1918, home service only*)
Frederick Marshall (*1 year in ASC Forage Dept then joined Regular Army, moved to Reading*)
George Mills (*1 year in ASC Forage Dept*)
George Mullins (*6 months ASC Remounts, invalided out*)
Arthur Welch (*7 months home service in ASC Forage Dept*)
